

# Klara hat

*Beret with rose*



**Hook:** 4,5 mm + 3 mm

**Yarn:** Wool, size 4 (aran/worsted), suitable for 4-5 mm hook, 75 gram (incl rose), Brand: Filcolana Peruvian highland wool, yardage: 50 g = 100 m.

Rose: wool yarn in size 1 (fingering).

**Stitches:** Chains (ch), double crochet (dc), half double crochet (hdc), single crochet (sc), decreased single crochet (sc dec), slip stitch (ss)

**Shell stitch:** 1 shell consists of: 3 dc in the same stitch. Between each set of dc stitches you make a sc.

The 3 dc is made in the sc, and the sc is made in the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc from the row before.

**Increase:** By crocheting 1 sc + 3 dc in the same stitch where you make your shell stitch.

**Decrease:** By crocheting 1 sc dec over the single crochet and the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc in the next shell.

You also decrease by skipping the sc dec from the row before (see video).

**Gauge:** 10 cm = 10 rows x 6 shells

**Size:** One size. The beret measures: 25 cm in diameter and fits a size 55 cm in head circumference.

### **Process:**

The beret is crocheted from the middle and out.

First you crochet a flat circle which measures 25 cm in diameter. Then you decrease on every row and lastly crochet 1 regular row. If your head measurement is bigger/smaller than 55 cm, or if you want the beret to be bigger in diameter you can continue the increase to make the circle bigger.

You crochet in the same direction for the entire process!

In the end a rose is crocheted and sewn onto the beret.

# HAT

4,5 mm hook

Row 1: Make a magic ring (or ch 4 and connect to a ring with 1 ss in the 1<sup>st</sup> ch), ch 2 (first stitch), into the ring crochet:

2 dc, 1 sc, 3 dc, 1 sc, 3 dc - so you have 3 shells.

Row 2: Into the first shell, make 1 sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc. Into the sc make: \*3 dc, 1 sc, 3 dc, in the next shell make 1 sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc\* repeat from \* to \* throughout the row.

Last increase is made in the 1<sup>st</sup> sc of the round.

Row 3: Make 1 sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc in the beginning of the new round – mark the sc – this is your first stitch in the round.

Make: \*3 dc in sc, 1 sc in the 2<sup>nd</sup> dc, in the next sc you make: 3 dc, 1 sc, 3 dc\* Repeat from \* to \* throughout the row.

The last increase is crocheted in the marked stitch from the row before.

Row 4-13: For every row, increase with 3 shells as described above – on the stitches where you are *not* increasing, you just crochet 3 dc into the sc.

Make sure to spread out the increases for every row so they are made *between* the increases from the row before.

You need to freestyle with the increases – it's not important *where* you make them, just as long as you don't make them in the increase from the row before – otherwise the hat will not be round!

When you have 13 rounds (25 cm in diameter), you stop the increase.

## DECREASE

Now you are going to decrease with 3 stitches per row, these are also spread out from row to row.

You decrease the following way:

Over the sc and 2<sup>nd</sup> dc make: 1 sc dec. See video.

So now you have: 1 sc followed by 1 sc dec.

On the next round you are *not* crocheting into the sc dec but you are still making 3 sc dec as described above.

After 20 rounds in total make 1 row with no decrease. Break off the yarn.



# ROSE

3 mm hook



You crochet a row that consists of dc, hdc and sc. You make 3 stitches into the same stitch and 1 sc between each set. This is repeated so there are 4 sets of each stitch.

Ch 28.

Make 3 dc into the 5<sup>th</sup> ch.

Make 1 sc into the next stitch, 3 dc into the next, 1 sc into the next. Repeat so you have 4 sets.

Make 3 hdc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next, repeat so you have 4 sets.

Make 3 sc in the next stitch, 1 sc in the next, repeat so you have 4 sets.

Break off the yarn.

Now curl up the row to a rose and sew it together on the wrong side so the row won't unravel. Sew onto the middle of the hat (or somewhere else on the hat)
